Over the past 40 years, Keany Produce & Gourmet has built a strong reputation across the mid-Atlantic region for providing customers with personal service and for delivering the finest quality produce at a reasonable price. Today, Keany Produce & Gourmet is still a family-owned business with each of the brothers taking an active role in the day-to-day operations and overall future company planning. There are six next-generation family members involved in the business, all of whom attended Catholic schools in the area. Additionally, a number of upper management are alumni of local Catholic schools.

The Keany Family has made it a core part of the business to give back to their community. Each week, Danny Keany provides fresh produce to the Little Sisters of the Poor. The company also donates fresh produce to local food hubs and kitchens – SOME, Martha's Table, The Father McKenna Center, and DC Central Kitchen. During the pandemic, Keany's Curbside Pay-It-Forward fundraiser amassed over \$100,000 worth of donations to provide fresh produce to the St. Lucy Project. Keany continually supports Catholic Charities, St. Mary's Basilica (Pheonix, Arizona), and PRS, Inc.

THE JAMES J. MATTHEWS LEGACY AWARD

JENNIE LEE TRAPASSO

t is with great pleasure that Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Arlington presents the 2022 James J. Matthews Legacy Award to Jennie Lee Trapasso.

The James J. Matthews Award was established on the 25th Anniversary of the Catholic Charities Ball. Mr. Matthews furnished the vision for the Ball and had the drive and determination to turn his idea into a reality. This Award honors his memory by recognizing individuals who embody Mr. Matthews' spirit and enduring commitment to Catholic Charities. Jennie Lee Trapasso was such an individual.



Jennie Lee passed away on December 21, 2021, after living with cancer for four years. Prior to her passing, she was informed that she was to be a 2022 Award recipient. She was thrilled, honored and humbled to be recognized for her years of service to Catholic Charities. Jennie and her late husband, Victor G. Trapasso, were members of the original Catholic Charities Ball Committee with Mr. Matthews and others. Jennie shared that their introduction to Catholic Charities and the support received from the agency enabled them to adopt their children, Michael and Laura, now Laura Adler.

Jennie Lee was born in Detroit, MI in 1936 to John W. and Jennie Gibson. She came to Northern Virginia with her family when she was 11 years old. She attended Washington-Lee High School and earned a BBA from the University of Michigan in 1958. She worked as secretary-treasurer and later CEO for the family real estate business and as an administrator for a local tax preparer.

Jennie volunteered for many charitable organizations and also served as an elections officer for the City of Alexandria. She served on the board of the Alexandria Hospital and, later, INOVA Hospital System. She was active with St. Stephen and St. Agnes Schools.

In 1989, Jennie chaired the Catholic Charities Ball with Ann Guiffre, also of Alexandria. The following year she became the Treasurer for the Ball until 2006. She was passionate about her service to Catholic Charities. Jennie was a person who brought great joy to all she met. She was known for her sparkling personality and brought a smile to everyone.

Jennie embodied the spirit of giving with her generosity of time, talent and treasure. Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Arlington is proud to present The James J. Matthews Legacy Award posthumously to Jennie Lee Trapasso.

MARY JOE BARRAZOTTO



t is with great pleasure that Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Arlington presents the 2022 James J, Matthews Legacy Award to Mary Joe Barrazotto.

The Matthews Legacy Award was established on the 25th Anniversary of the Catholic Charities Ball. Mr. Matthews supplied not only the vision for the Ball, but also the drive and determination to make the event a reality. This Award honors his memory by recognizing individuals who embody Mr. Matthews' spirit and everlasting commitment.

Since the beginning of the Ball's existence, Mary Joe Barrazotto has been involved in leadership roles in her church, community, business and family. She was born in Arlington, VA on November 19, 1940 to Charles and Virginia Radigan. She was the only daughter with three brothers—Mac, Tom and Bill.

Mary Joe went to school in Arlington, starting in St. Agnes in 4th grade and then attended Marymount High School. She participated in the Catholic Youth program at St. Agnes where she was recognized, "from the pulpit," for her participation.

After marrying Richard Barrazotto in 1959, Mary Joe raised four children, Richard Jr., Mary, Matthew and John. She is now the proud grandmother of nine grandchildren and has four great-grandchildren.

While raising four children was a full-time job, Mary Joe was an active member of the Service League of Northern Virginia, holding various officer roles and chairing numerous fundraisers such as the Tiara Ball. She volunteered at St. Agnes School where her three sons attended elementary school.

After her children were in high school, Mary Joe began working full time at the family business, Clements Pastry Shop. She ran the office for more than 30 years, keeping a firm handle on her three sons as they took over management of the business from their dad.

While working full time, Mary Joe continued to support various non-profit organizations. As a proud supporter of Catholic Charities, Mary Joe served on several Catholic Charities Ball Committees before working closely with Dee Estes to chair the Ball in 1994. Since then, she has been a long-standing member of the advisory board and she and Richard contribute annually to the Ball to support its various programs to help those in need. Currently, Mary Joe proudly supports Missionhurst, including working with others to decorate the altar with fresh flowers and plants. She and Richard attend Mass at Missionhurst every Sunday.

Throughout her life, Mary Joe has more than exemplified the spirit of the Matthews Award with faith, grace and dignity. Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Arlington is proud to present The James J. Matthews Legacy Award to Mary Joe Barrazotto.

BISHOP PAUL STEPHEN LOVERDE LEGACY AWARD

CHRIST THE REDEEMER CATHOLIC CHURCH

ach year, the Bishop Paul S. Loverde Legacy Award honors a person, parish, or organization within our diocese that has demonstrated an extraordinary commitment to serving the poor through its commitment to and support of Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Arlington. Catholic Charities is pleased to present this year's award to Christ the Redeemer Catholic Church, Sterling.



Christ the Redeemer, a multicultural and multilingual parish that is home to 11,700 parishioners, this year celebrates the $50^{\rm th}$ anniversary of its founding. The parish has a deep commitment to sharing the love of Christ and meeting the needs of its neighbors through compassion and charity.

Under the leadership of Father Jaffe, Christ the Redeemer has been tireless in its efforts to tend to the needs of the local community, regardless of whether or not they are parishioners of Christ the Redeemer. Over the past 18 months Christ the Redeemer has provided an astounding \$800,000 in emergency assistance to families affected by COVID-19 to ensure they could remain in their homes, provide for their children, and get back to work. The parish worked closely with Catholic Charities to refer families who could benefit from COVID-19 relief monies, including CARES Act funds. The parish also provided for families who did not qualify for this funding. Fr. Jaffe tirelessly sought out private foundation grants, appealed to the parish for contributions, and found major donors who were willing to provide matching gifts in order to help as many vulnerable households as possible.

Christ the Redeemer has been a great collaborator with Catholic Charities, which maintains a permanent office at the parish, currently used by the Office of Newcomer Services. As a strong advocate for the poor, Fr. Jaffe frequently shares with his parishioners the work of Catholic Charities, inviting their support of the ministry. In 2019 his parish hosted Catholic Charities and welcomed Bishop Michael Burbidge who celebrated a special World Day of the Poor Mass. This Catholic Charities event included a winter coat collection to benefit the rural poor served by Catholic Charities' Mercy (Mobile Response Center) Van. This past autumn, Christ the Redeemer opened its facilities to Catholic Charities staff for its first daylong all-staff gathering since the onset of the pandemic.

For their unwavering commitment to serving the poor and partnering with Catholic Charities, we are honored to present this award to Father Jaffe and Christ the Redeemer.



his evening, the Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Arlington is celebrating the 40th Ball—Remembering the Past with Gratitude in which we celebrate past accomplishments and look forward to continued success in providing our support to Catholic Charities programs. This organization has been working towards meeting the needs of the marginalized and underserved for the past 74 years.

This year we welcome Vicki Foster and Karen Skinner as this year's Ball Chairs. We are forever thankful to all of those who have served before us and those to come who continue to volunteer year after year to join the Ball Committee in its endeavor to create this beautiful evening for all to enjoy and especially to raise funding to benefit those who most need our support in the Arlington Diocese. Catholic Charities is especially grateful for all you do to help them in their mission but those most grateful hearts are those who are uplifted due to your generosity.

The Catholic Charities Ball was created in 1981 when James J. 


