Introduction to Trauma-Informed Care from 9am-10am in Room 1

Ronnie Roth—Director, Catholic Charities Diocese of Arlington, St. Margaret of Cortona

The experience of trauma takes away choice and control. The trauma-informed healing environment maximizes opportunities for understanding the implication of trauma on physical as well as behavioral health. Healing happens in the context of relationships between families, youth, and providers built on mutual trust, respect, and empowerment. Understanding the three “E’s” of Trauma helps all of us interact with greater sensitivity and effectiveness.
