What We Do:

- Provide transitional assistance to individuals leaving the Loudoun Adult Detention Center (ADC) prior to and on release day.
- Offer spiritual guidance and strength from the teachings of the Church and the Bible, rosaries, prayer cards and other devotional materials.
- Supply transportation and basic items on day of release.
- Help to obtain information for social services, shelter, job opportunities and other post release needs.
- Set up contact with family and/or other loved ones.
- Provide breakfast/lunch on day of release and limited follow-up mentoring and spiritual support.

How We Do It:

- Work through existing Catholic Charities in-facility Sunday Scripture study program at ADC to identify those inmates that may need transitional assistance upon their release.
- Meet with inmates requesting transitional assistance in special visitations. Support them, before release, in filling out and submitting all necessary forms and procedures.
- Work with outside sources to obtain shelter, job opportunities and other assistance as needed.
- Meet on day of release to provide transportation, a meal, and spiritual materials and, as the opportunity presents, participate in prayer and church service.
- Work closely with the staff at ADC within existing policies and procedures to add to the current release program in a smooth and efficient manner.
- Meet at least once a month to pray and ask the Holy Spirit for continued guidance and to:
 - \cdot review current and future cases,
 - \cdot discuss new ideas and possible program improvements,
 - · modify existing approaches,
 - \cdot assess adequacy of support given, and
 - \cdot review ongoing volunteer recruiting.
