Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Arlington (CCDA) believes in a world without hunger. However, in our own diocese, over 250,000 people are considered food insecure—they do not know where their next meal will come from. The first Corporal Act of Mercy is to "Feed the Hungry". We are called by Christ to help.

Catholic Charities is proud to have The St. Lucy Food Project (SLP) help to feed the hungry. The main warehouse in Manassas receives, processes, and disperses the food gathered throughout the diocese working in conjunction with three St. Lucy Pantries, three food depots, and over 100 community, faith-based, clinics and mobile distribution sites in our network.

MANASSAS: 8426-28 Kao Circle. Manassas, VA 20110;

o **703-479-2975:** This warehouse is strategically located near interstate highways to supply food to the diocese-wide pantry network. Using company owned vehicles and volunteers in private vehicles, food is distributed to over 100 community-based organization pantries (CBO's) which includes 40 parishes, and over 38 interfaith, community, and government agencies.

On the front lines fighting hunger, The St. Lucy Food Project provides staff and critical volunteers for 3 major CCDA food pantries: Alexandria, Leesburg, and Front Royal:

• CHRIST HOUSE:

- o 131 South West St., Alexandria, VA 22314
 - **703-548-4227:** This pantry distributes food to 60 to 70 walk-in client families Wed and Thurs, 9:00AM to 1:00PM.

• LEESBURG REGIONAL OFFICE:

- o 113 Executive Dr., Building #2, Suite 110, Sterling, VA 20166
 - **703-443-2481:** This pantry distributes food to 60 to 80 client families Monday thru Thursday, 9:30AM to 2:30PM.

• LOAVES AND FISHES:

- o 613 N. Royal Ave., Front Royal, VA 22630
 - **540-252-4320:** This pantry distributes food to 120 families, Tues 1:00PM to 4:00PM, and Thurs and Fri, 9:00AM to 2:00PM. It also serves as a depot for the Knights of Columbus to deliver food to rural area pantries in the far western corners of the diocese.

The St. Lucy Food Project bears witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ, conferring and uplifting human dignity by providing basic human, nutritional needs in solidarity with the most vulnerable, regardless of race, religion, and national origin-nourishing souls as we feed the hungry.

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Steps to Conducting a Successful Food Drive:

Planning Phase:

- 1) Learn about the St. Lucy Food Project
- 2) Understand how Food Ministry works in and around your parish.
 - See the Food Insecurity Statistics in this packet
- 3) Develop a plan to incorporate the St. Lucy Food Project into your parish.
 - Identify potential dates for food collection (Fall, Winter/Lent, Summer).
 - o Contact Lori Sikra at Lori.sikra@ccda.net for available date(s).
 - Gain approval from pastor.
 - Build a consensus with stakeholders
 - o Knights of Columbus, Youth Ministry, Religious Ed, etc.
 - Set a date for bag distribution, if using St. Lucy blue bags.
 - Build your volunteer support foundation.
 - Recruit volunteers to help distribute blue bags 1-2 weeks prior to collection date, if distributing.
 - OR 4-8 volunteers if you're planning a No-Contact Drive-Thru Food Drive. No-Contact Drive-Thru Food Drives take place in one day typically from 10-2 PM and allows donors to drive up to a drop off location with volunteers there to retrieve their donations from trunks or backseats while the donor remains in their vehicles. A combination of the two models can be done if hosting a weekend collection.
 - Secure a volunteer driver responsible for driving a St. Lucy Project vehicle for collecting and returning the donations to the Manassas warehouse. All drivers must be pre-approved by the Diocese (see item #5), and review and acknowledge understanding of St. Lucy's Vehicle Safety Procedures. For St. Lucy vehicles and other transport options see last page.
 - o Recruit 4-5 volunteers to meet at the Manassas warehouse at the end of the drive with the vehicle to help unload the donations.
 - o Remember, kids are a great source for recruiting volunteers who usually need service hours.

- 4) Complete and submit The Food Drive Sign Up Form included in this kit to Lori Sikra at lori.sikra@ccda.net
- 5) Complete and submit the Driver Authorization form for the volunteer driver.
 - https://www.arlingtondiocese.org/risk-management/driver-program/authorized-driver-program/
 - Submit it to <u>riskmanagement@arlingtondiocese.org</u> and copy Lori Sikra at <u>lori.sikra@ccda.net</u> no later than 2 weeks before the event.
 - Drivers <u>MUST</u> review our vehicle safety procedures with our warehouse team prior to the food drive or at the time of pick up. Contact Lori Sikra to arrange a time. Please note: all vehicles belong to Catholic Charities and <u>MUST</u> be driven with the upmost care and caution according to the safety procedures.

Execution Phase:

- 1) **3 weeks prior to date**: Submit bulletin announcement to be published 2 weeks prior to collection date.
- 2) **2 weeks prior:** Coordinate blue bag pick up plans from the warehouse and staple St. Lucy Food Project flier or own personalized flier to the bags.
- 3) 1 week prior: Make an announcement from the Pulpit and distribute bags after mass.
 - Have volunteers at each exit handing out bags to parishioners.
 - o They should be positioned at the doors right after Communion.
 - The bags in the boxes should be placed by the door for easy distribution before mass. This does go quickly. Be ready.
 - Left over bags can be kept in the vestibule for people coming to daily Mass during the week.
 - Religious Ed students can pass them out before and after classes that week. You can also pass out at daily Masses.

4) Friday or Saturday before the collection:

- Pick up van or truck from the St. Lucy Manassas Warehouse.
 - o Park the vehicle in a highly visible area near the church entrance but not where it will impede traffic.
 - Please coordinate where to park the vehicle with your pastor and the St. Lucy Project Foreman.


5) Collection Day:

• Have volunteers arrive at least 20 minutes prior to the event.

- OSpaced them out by the collection location(s) to take the donations from donors to immediately load in the vehicle.
- Collect monetary donation in St. Lucy's collection box or envelope. Checks should be payable to "CCDA", with "St. Lucy Project" on the memo line.
- oReturn vehicle at the end of the event.
- oPlace any unused boxes or bags in the truck.

Loading the Truck

- oFor loading all vehicles, **DO NOT** pre-sort donations in containers or take donations out of bags. This complicates the loading and unloading and will cause the vehicle to be unbalanced and a safety risk when transporting donations back to the warehouse.
- The inside perimeter of our F450, 15-foot box truck will be loaded with 2 large gaylord boxes (on pallets) in the very back with smaller 2x2 boxes along the sides. Fill the gaylord boxes first to the brim, followed by the smaller 2x2's, then fill the floor. If needed, you can overflow the boxes, keeping in mind an even balance of weight for safety.
- The F450 truck has a weight capacity 8,500-pounds and should not be
 - filled beyond that capacity. The truck's bowed shock absorbers in photo will begin to flatten if it reaches capacity. Loading should cease at this point.
- oIf using the F650 22-foot truck staffed by a St. Lucy team



For monetary collections

oChecks should be made out to: Catholic Charities or CCDA with "St. Lucy Project" in the memo

Wrap Up Phase:

- 1) Communicate and publicize results in the next bulletin. Thank parishioners for their support. Weight totals will be emailed within 48 hours after the drive.
- 2) Establish a plan to collect from those who miss the date (e.g. take to parish office).
- 3) Get feedback from volunteers to improve for next time.

4) Please keep a record of your food totals. If you work with your Knights group, you may submit a **Food for Families** form to the Supreme Council. (see attached KoC form #10057). Send to Lori Sikra for the Food Bank Representative Signature.

Main Points to Consider:

- 1) Get a date on the calendar and your core volunteers as soon as possible.
- 2) Distributing St. Lucy blue bags increases food donations up to 8 times more.
- 3) Communication through the Bulletin, Mass announcements, Facebook and other social media outlets is key to a successful drive.

The Knights of Columbus Food for Families Reimbursement Program was established in 2012. Under this program, local Knights of Columbus councils, assemblies and circles make contributions of money and/or food to a local

community food bank or parish food pantry. For every \$500 or 1,000 pounds of food contributed, the council or assembly is eligible for a refund of \$100 from the Supreme Council. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$500 per fraternal year.

For Columbian Squires circles, for every \$100 or 200 pounds of food contributed, the circle is eligible for a refund of \$20 from the Supreme Council.

Reimbursement **must** be applied for in the fraternal year during which contributions were made.

As resources permit, councils, assemblies and circles may provide support to multiple food banks and/or food pantries. The minimum contribution to qualify for a refund is \$500 (\$100 for Squires circles) or 1,000 pounds of food

(200 pounds for Squires circles) for each food bank/food pantry supported.

In addition to a refund for contributions, councils, assemblies and circles are also eligible to receive a Food for Families plaque (and, in successive years, date plates signifying years of participation) in recognition of manpower support provided to food banks and food pantries. Significant manpower support is required and should be outlined in Section II of this application.





The image of St. Lucy has her holding a stalk of wheat in one hand and a dish with eyes in the other. The wheat is to remind us of her passion to feed the hungry. There are many stories of her bringing bread to early Christians hiding in the Catacombs in the dead of night so they would not starve. She would often wear a wreath of candles on her head to light her way. The eyes symbolize that she is the Patron Saint to the blind; and quite often, we are blind to the hungry in our own communities. This is why St. Lucy is our Patron Saint. May she always guide us to see the hungry and help feed them.
